

Civic Knowledge Project

- The Mission of the CKP is to develop and strengthen community connections, helping to overcome the social, economic, and racial divisions among the various knowledge communities on the South Side of Chicago.
- Courses and other educational opportunities are low cost (sometimes free) and financial assistance is available.



Civic Knowledge Project



- Examples
 - Poverty, Promise, and Possibility A curricular package of courses, lectures, and activities in local communities aimed at continuing the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.
 - The Odyssey Project Yearlong college credit courses in five humanities subjects – literature, U.S. History, critical thinking and writing, philosophy, and art history.

UChicago Promise

- University of Chicago's pledge to help increase college access and readiness for Chicago high school students.
- Chicago Consortium on School Research shows Chicago area students are frequently "under-matched" in their selection of a college.

- Brings together several new initiatives
 - Debt-Free pledge,
 - No application fee for Chicago students,
 - Admissions Academy for high schools counselors –with strong existing programs –Neighborhood Schools Program, Collegiate Scholars, College Bridge, etc.

UCHICAGO LOCAL


