STUDYING THREATS TO US MEMBERS OF CONGRESS



Over 200 charged threats by Deprt of Justice from 2001 to 2024


- Developed definition of threat "event" and collected data by event, by target, and by perpetrator.
 - One "event" occurs when:
 - One perpetrator threatens one leader and is charged (77%)
 - One perpetrator threatens multiple leaders and is charged for multiple targets in the same court docket (19.5%).
 - Multiple perpetrators threaten the same leader at the same time and more than one is charged (3.3%)
 - Perpetrator (s) threaten political leader (s) but is killed prior to being charged (<1%).
- Searched for threats to over 1600 members of Congress in legal data bases by:
 - federal charge (eg, 18 U.S.C. § 115 (Assaulting, kidnapping, murdering a US official or their family, or threatening to do so)
 - Google advanced search by name.
- CPOST study seeks to understand the changing trajectory, balance of target political identification, and perpetrator motives.

SPIKE IN PROSECUTED THREAT EVENTS SINCE 2017



DOJ prosecutions increased 5x during the Trump administration and have continued under Biden

Average Annual Number of Threat Events By Presidential Term, 2001 - 2024




*Event "dates" are determined by start date of an event, not when the perpetrator is prosecuted or cha

OVERALL FINDING



Growing Risks of:

- 1. Political Violence to Leaders from Both Parties
- 2. Especially lone wolf and small group, not just violent protests
