

#### **KEY FINDINGS ON INSURRECTIONIST MOVEMENT**

- A broader mass movement with violence at its core
- A political movement, not ordinary criminal behavior
- A political minority in many places
- The right-wing theory of "Great Replacement" is the key driver.





- Unaffiliated with any group: 569



Capitol Hill Arrests, 2021





- 357 unique counties





## Regression Results (Negative Binomial)



- The **more rural** the county, the **lower** the county rate of sending insurrectionists.
- The higher the percentage county vote for Trump, the lower the rate of sending insurrectionists.
- The greater the decrease in non-Hispanic white, the higher the rate of sending insurrectionists.
- For every 1 standard deviation decline in the white population (~1%), the number of expected insurrectionists increases by 25%. This would happen by chance less than 1 in a thousand times.

#### WHY COMMUNITY SUPPORT MATTERS



## Makes it easy to "rationalize" violent action

- 1. Reduces Willingness to provide intelligence to authorities
- 2. Forms a pool from which violent activists typically emerge
- 3. Increases the legitimacy of violent actors, encouraging violence by providing a popular mandate without which violent actors would be merely criminals
- 4. Increases risk-taking by violent actors because perception of "safety in numbers." In essence, the violent actor thinks, "I will act if I have community support, because I will have safety in numbers and be protected from informants."





#### Nationally Representative Sample:

- 2,000 American Adults, Data collected Sept 24-27, 2021
- A random sample of 40,000 nationally representative adults
- Fielded by NORC at the University of Chicago (AmeriSpeak panel)
- The **gold standard** among polls, used by NORC for federal government

#### Highly Reliable Extrapolation to General Population

Confidence interval: ±2.9%











#### KEY FINDING #2:

# The 21 million are Not Fading

#### One might expect 9.3 months after Jan 6:


- 1. Interest would naturally wane
- 2. Arresting 650+ would have a chilling effect
- 3. De-platforming Trump would de-energize support for violent restoration

#### **Instead:**

- 1. Movement is large and stable from June to Sept (21 million)
- 2. May well continue (or grow) with the coming election season and as Trump launches his own social media platform
- 3. There is a large mass of kindling waiting for an incendiary moment

## TWO MAJOR BELIEFS IN 21 MILLION



Great Replacement (by Democratic Party): "The Democratic Party is trying to replace the current electorate...with new people, more obedient voters from the Third World"



Qanon Cult: "A secret group of Satanworshipping pedophiles is ruling the US government"



Percentage Variation in explained by:





Percentage variation explained by:








## Traditional media more prevalent than social media

#### CPOST RISK ASSESSMENT TOOLS

- CPOST Insurrectionist Index <sup>®</sup>
  - At National, State and Local levels
- County-level measures of risk of insurrectionists
- CPOST Great Replacement Index<sup>®</sup> and Measures of Other Drivers of Insurrectionist Sentiments
- All Tools measure <u>change over</u> <u>time</u>, including reaction to potential triggers and policy response.

#### **CONCLUSION**



- A broader mass movement with violence at its core, not merely a mix of right-wing organizations
- A political movement, not ordinary criminal behavior, although crimes may be committed
- A political minority in many places, not only centered in "red" parts of the country
- We see similar findings in all three studies (e.g., statistically significant evidence) that the "Great Replacement" is the key driver.



# THOROUGH + TIMELY KNOWLEDGE OF COMMUNITY SUPPORT INFORMS RISK MANAGEMENT

**Risk Management** = Balance action versus over-reaction

#### **Urgently needed knowledge:**

- Change of insurrectionist sentiments in the US public over time
- Sentiments of potential first movers (e.g., militia members)
- Rapid changes in public sentiments at any level (national, state, local) following potential triggering events
- CPOST has developed credible predictive risk management tools and continues to refine them.

#### **COMMUNITY SUPPORT KEY TO POLITICAL VIOLENCE**





"Generating active popular support often has the greatest impact on the insurgency's long-term effectiveness. This is the center of gravity of the insurgency. Popular support results in safe havens, freedom of movement, logistic support, financial support, intelligence, and new personnel for the insurgency. Generating such support has a positive feedback effect on an insurgent organization. As the insurgent group gains in support, its capabilities grow. These enable it to gain more support."
