Be enrolled</li><li>2. Have submitted a 2020-2021 FAFSA indicating the University as a recipient by May 16, 2021.</li><li>3. Have reported in their 2020-2021 FAFSA a 2018 income from work of equal to or less than the applicable threshold<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. If their 2018 income exceeded the applicable threshold, but they had experienced a reduction in 2020 annual income that would meet the income threshold for eligibility, they had the opportunity to supplement their HEERF application with proof of estimated annual income for 2020.</li></ol></li><li>4.
