Created by the D+I Studio, these downloadable Inclusive Illustrations offer an alternative to the limited representation of traditional stock photography and illustrations for use in the creation of presentations, marketing materials, social media posts, websites, print materials, and video content.

Inclusive Illustrations feature:

- Individuals representing various races, body shapes, ages, genders, and abilities
- In-person and remote activities
- Iconic UChicago landmarks including Cobb Gate and the Joe and Rika Mansueto Library

The Inclusive Illustrations set is free to use and is licensed under a Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International License.

How to Use

Included in the downloadable zip file are three folders, each containing the Inclusive Illustrations in a different format:

JPG

- Ready-to-use photos with a white background
- Upload or insert in presentations and other documents

PNG

- Ready-to-use photos with a transparent background
- Upload or insert in presentations and other documents

SVG

- Vector graphic format commonly used on websites
- May be opened in vector software (i.e., Adobe Illustrator) for editing and modification

Use the JPG and PNG files as you would any other photo, graphic, or illustration. If you or your team have access to vector software, use the SVG files for more flexibility.
