
David B. Rowley

1954 - 2024

David Ballantyne Rowley was born on March 14, 1954 and passed away on May 30, 2024. He received his BS from Denison University in 1976 and his MS and PhD from the State University of New York at Albany in 1980 and 1983, respectively. After serving as a Research Associate and Senior Research Associate at the University of Chicago, he joined the faculty in the Department of the Geophysical Sciences in 1993 where he remained until his retirement in 2024. Along the way, he served as Department Chair from 1999 – 2006, and was the Editor of the Journal of Geology, run by the department, from 2008 – 2021.

David's research focused on understanding the motion of Earth's tectonic plates over its history and how they connect to the interior evolution of the Earth. He made significant contributions to the fields of paleogeography, paleoaltimetry, the formation of the Himalaya-Tibet Plateau, and the central role of heat from Earth's core in driving tectonic movement. He advised and served as a mentor for many early-career scientists, from undergraduate and graduate students, to postdocs, and junior faculty throughout his career. David's work earned him recognition from the American Geophysical Union, where he was named a Fellow in 2018.
