

University of Chicago Police Department Community Engagement

The University of Chicago Police Department (UCPD) has worked to keep our communities safe for more than 40 years. This professionally trained, accredited police department operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and is staffed with state-certified officers.


UCPD has primary responsibility for patrolling the University of Chicago campus and University property, and serves in a supportive role in its extended patrol area (from 37th Street on the north to 64th Street on the south, and roughly Cottage Grove Avenue on the west to Lake Michigan on the east) where the Chicago Police Department (CPD) is the primary policing agency.



Transparency

UCPD provides access to a range of data and information on its day-to-day operations. This information goes beyond what Illinois law requires of police departments at private institutions, but is provided as a way to enhance the transparency of its policing activities. This includes UCPD's daily crime/fire log at incidentreports.uchicago.edu and the Illinois Traffic Stop Study at idot.illinois.gov.

UCPD will also provide arrest records upon request, similar to the information provided by public law enforcement agencies.



Community Advisory Committee

UCPD's Community Advisory Committee provides a way to strengthen the department's relationship and collaborate with area residents on safety issues affecting residents of UCPD's extended patrol area. In addition to providing feedback from community members, the advisory committee helps promote UCPD's services through increased education on police activities and programs.

Community Advisory Committee members represent areas within UCPD's patrol area, and were chosen in consultation with community leaders and local aldermen representing the Third, Fourth, Fifth, and 20th wards. A representative of the University's Office of Civic Engagement also sits on the committee.



Questions and Concerns

UCPD welcomes feedback and encourages individuals to report concerns regarding services received by members of the department. You can provide anonymous feedback or file a formal complaint online at safety-security.uchicago.edu or in person at UCPD Headquarters.

An Independent Review Committee examines complaints against UCPD, as well as department reports and related policy, procedural, and communication issues. The committee consists of three faculty, three students, two staff, and three community members appointed by the University provost. Annual reports are available at safety-security.uchicago.edu.

Community Relations Unit

UCPD's Community Relations Unit (CRU) helps build and strengthen relationships between members of the UChicago community and UCPD through education, intervention, and policing initiatives.

The CRU works to identify and analyze crime hazards in our community, and comes up with strategies to help minimize them. The unit also provides members of the University community with a variety of services, including safety presentations, community outreach initiatives, and bicycle and laptop registration.


