UCPD PRESENTING PROGRAM TO LOCAL YOUTH

The UCPD is presenting the Law & Your Community program to students at the Woodlawn Charter School this fall so students are aware of their rights as citizens and understand the best ways to engage with law enforcement. Members of the UCPD's Community Relations Unit (CRU) received training for the Law & Your Community course through the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE). CRU members present this program to 12-15 middle school aged students once a week for the duration of the 12-week program. This hands-on, interactive training uses scenarios, presentations, and videos so students become familiar with citizenship, basic laws, and law enforcement engagement.
