Monday, May 21, 2018

8am–5pm | Smart Museum of Art

Time to say goodbye and return the artwork. Try not to get too many tears on the frame.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I participate in the Art to Live With program?

View the collection in advance to pick a few favorite pieces. Come to the ART-B-Q on Thursday, September 28, view the pop up exhibition, or look at the @art_to_live_with Instagram. Wake up early on Sunday, October 1, run to the Smart Museum of Art, and wait until the Art Match starts at 8am (we'll provide donuts and coffee to wake you up!). Make sure you get a good spot because art is first come, first served!

What do I need to bring?

Bring a valid UChicago Student ID and your housemates for good company.

Where is the Smart Museum of Art?

The Smart Museum of Art is located at 5550 S. Greenwood Avenue, situated to the west of the Henry Crown Field House and Campus North.

If I won't be here fall quarter, but I still want artwork for my room. Can I borrow it later in the year?

As much as we'd like to say yes, you cannot. Artwork can only be borrowed during Art Match.

How do I know which artwork is available for loan?

To see the Art to Live With collection in person, come to the ART-B-Q on Thursday, September 28. The pop-up exhibition of the collection will be on view September 29–30. If you cannot wait that long, please visit the @art_to_live_with Instagram or the Smart Museum of Art's website.

They all look so great! Can I borrow more than one?

Students can borrow only one artwork per year, but we appreciate your enthusiasm!

This sounds awesome, how much does the artwork cost to borrow?

Luckily for you, the Art to Live With program is completely free. The entire cost of the program is covered through the generous support of Greg Wendt, AB'83 who once borrowed an Art to Live With print by Sven Lukin. The print is installed in Burton-Judson, and it's making a special appearance in the pop-up exhibition.

Who hangs the artwork in my room?

You do! We will give you Command Hooks and a hanging and care sheet that guides you through the process.

Can I hang it in my House lounge or common room?

Artwork is to be hung only in your dorm room. It may not be placed in any other location, including the House lounge and/or common rooms.

If I move to a new room, or leave campus, what happens to the artwork?

Contact Emily Edwards at 773.834.1989 or emilyedwards@uchicago.edu. If you move within the dorm, the artwork moves with you. You will receive new Command Hooks to rehang the artwork, and must provide your new room number. If you are going abroad, the artwork needs to be returned to the Smart Museum of Art. You must coordinate its early return.

If the artwork is accidentally damaged, what should I do?

Do not try to fix it; you may end up damaging the artwork further. Contact Emily Edwards at 773.834.1989 or emilyedwards@uchicago.edu and notify your RAs/RHs immediately. We will schedule a visit to assess the damage, be prepared to describe exactly what happened. If the frame is unstable, lay the artwork on a flat, clean surface.

How do I return the artwork?

Returns are scheduled on May 21, 2018. In addition to the artwork, bring your UChicago Student ID, loan agreement, and the 2 Command Hooks. Any missing components may incur a fee.
