



**Reports of Harassment, Discrimination and Sexual Misconduct
Involving UChicago Students**

On an annual basis, the Office of the Dean of Students in the University will release statistics and information on reports from the previous academic year that allege harassment, discrimination and sexual misconduct involving students at the University, including matters heard by the University-wide Student Disciplinary Committee in which a student is the accused.

The data presented below derive from reports and formal complaints that were submitted between July 1, 2014, and June 30, 2015.

Table I. Number of reports

The table below indicates the number of unique reports/complaints where the complainant and/or respondent is a student at the University. A complainant may direct an allegation against more than one respondent.
