Reports of Harassment, Discrimination and Sexual Misconduct Involving UChicago Students

On an annual basis, the Office of the Dean of Students in the University will release statistics and information on reports from the previous academic year that allege harassment, discrimination and sexual misconduct involving students at the University, including matters heard by the University-wide Student Disciplinary Committee in which a student is the accused.

The data presented below derive from reports and formal complaints that were received between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2016. Each academic year begins July 1 and ends June 30.
